<u>FLA 8</u> <u>Course outline</u>

French Language Arts is an important part of education as it equips students with knowledge that will enable them to become functionally bilingual citizens.

The main goals of the middle school French Immersion Program are to prepare students to:

- 1. Become functionally bilingual citizens in the workplace.
- 2. Acquire knowledge of the French language.
- 3. Develop French comprehension skills to improve reading.
- 4. Use critical thinking to explore literature and writing.
- 5. Be exposed to the different facets of French Canadian culture.
- 6. Increase their vocabulary in order to use French spontaneously in the classroom setting.
- 7. Commit to lifelong learning of the French language.

Evaluation:

The students will be evaluated following the objectives of the curriculum. They will receive a score between Excelling and Limited representing their comprehension of the material. The objectives will be laid out ahead of time so that the student can understand what their goals are and these will be reviewed and evaluated daily by the teacher.

<u>Homework:</u>

French practice is to be expected on a daily basis, especially French reading. Homework time will of course vary from student to student. Students that do not utilize class time or those experiencing difficulty will generally have more work to take home. Students that require extra help are welcome to set up a time for tutoring with myself. These times could be before school, at lunchtime or after school.

Students that have not completed their homework will receive an incomplete. Students must still complete the assignments to satisfy the necessary skills. Homework marks will be given until the assignment is handed in possibly resulting in a "Period 6" (staying in at lunch and recess time to complete work) Rewrite for tests and exams are a possibility but only after students have devised a plan for success. This includes correcting the original test or exam and preparing for the rewrite after consultation with the student, teacher and parent.
